
Recently, I had the opportunity to speak with a grandmother who faithfully brings her fiveyear-old granddaughter to church every Sunday. She shared with me how much **her granddaughter looks forward to Sunday school and coming to church each week**. This testimony was such a great encouragement. At times, we may wonder whether we are making a difference—but we are truly thankful for the opportunity to impact young lives and to share the gospel with them.

I had the opportunity to preach during one of the services, and during the invitation, **a young lady made a profession of faith in Christ**.

In May, we traveled to Fukushima Prefecture for the **annual family camp at Adatara Bible Camp**. This camp brings together churches from all over northeastern Japan and is a rare but valuable time of fellowship with fellow believers we usually see only once a year. It was a deeply encouraging time, and during the camp, two individuals made decisions to be baptized—a tremendous blessing.

We also had a wonderful Easter service this year. For our annual children's **Easter celebration**, **we were blessed to have 19 children in attendance**. Our ministry partner, Kimiyo Canter, presented a very clear and powerful message on the Easter story and the gospel. For some of the children, this was their first time hearing the gospel.
