We should not leave off inviting people to church; there are those out there who are looking for help in their spiritual lives. Please continue to pray for the brother who is discouraged. He has a difficult life financially as he has a large family and not a very good income. Two of his boys are physically impaired. One is completely blind and the other is legally blind and almost deaf. One of these boys is a young adult and the other a teen, and the parents don't really have the knowledge or resources to help them towards independence. I have been thinking about how I can help to prepare them. Prayer for wisdom in this regard would be appreciated.

Our evangelistic meeting did not go as we had hoped. The lost people in the community did not attend; however, we did have numerous other families visit that were very encouraged by what we were attempting. One family has continued coming, and our prayer is that we will be able to keep ministering to them.

It is difficult at times to ascertain the Lord's will for the people. Prayer for wisdom is appreciated - not only for me, but also for others who teach the Bible in this ministry.
