Last month we graduated several of our Bible Institute students and sent them out to fill their new roles in ministry. Samuel (pictured left) is joining with Pastor Soapa in the Dapaong area to help strengthen and further develop that area in church planting endeavors. He especially has a heart for the Sableanga church where he was saved, but with his wonderful servant's heart, will also be a blessing to other congregations in that region of the country. Germain

(pictured middle) is returning to his home area of Tchaloude where we have 3 young church plants, and one established congregation. He has demonstrated both willingness and desire to serve the Lord to the fullest, and will be a great blessing and encouragement to Pastor Abalo who serves the congregations in that area.



We praise the Lord that we were able to finish the building at the Calvary Baptist Church of Lome II just before the rains became heavy. We still marvel at the way that God brought this piece of property to us, now located in a strategic area of Kara near the new market. We are presently constructing 75 benches to put in the new building with the hope, that many who are seated on them will hear the gospel and accept Christ as Savior.

As we approached camp season this year we again realized that as we have trained and worked with counselors over the years, that this has produced young spiritual



leadership in the church. We trusted God to again provide in each location the people we needed to effectively work with the kids who would come. After a busy summer of camps we can say without reservation that God answered our prayers and provided perfectly the young people we needed to work with in each village. As a result of their willingness to serve, we saw kids accept Christ as Savior.

Maurice who is pastor at the Lassa church has been praying for quite a few years for God to send him a Godly wife. We recently celebrated with him God's answer to his prayers as he married a sweet girl named Esther.

One of the great disappointments of our 8 month church shut-down due to Covid was the amount of young people who committed immorality while the church doors were closed. Not all have come back to church, and very few have been willing to go through the church discipline process to be restored. But we are thrilled that one young couple, Etienne and Josephine were willing to humble themselves and submit so that they could again serve the Lord at the Lassa church.
